### 2005-06 Governor's Budget Recommendations Workforce Education

- \$23 million increase for workforce development in public schools
- \$20 million increase to enhance Florida's community colleges' workforce development programs
- \$18.1 million in new federal funds to improve and expand adult education, workforce literacy, and workforce readiness
- \$7 million for public schools and \$10 million for community colleges through Performance Based Incentives
- \$24.7 million (\$20 million for community colleges and \$4.7 million for public schools) to create workforce development programs targeting high skill, high wage occupation
