

Standard Operating Procedures

Post-Secondary Employment Outcomes (PSEO)

Demographic File

Last Updated: February 3, 2025

I. Purpose

This operating procedure specifies the standard layout of the demographic file that partners will supply for use in processing and producing the Post-Secondary Employment Outcomes (PSEO). However, in contrast to the Degree File SOP, some parts of this file are provided as a guideline for institutions as opposed to a strict file specification.

II. Notes

The most important variable of this file is *residency*. We intend to use residency to provide tabulations of employment flows for students who began in or out of state. For this reason, residency ought to be based on *geographic residency*, not residency for tuition purposes. We also ask for specific values for residency. *For students attending a private institution, it is unlikely the institution collects residency, so all values should be "N" (Not collected), rather than "O" (Out-of-state).*

In addition to residency, there are other variables which will only be available for certain students. We expect missing data in these fields (e.g., SAT scores for a doctoral student). We explicitly mention when missingness is expected. Missing SSNs are not an issue, so transfer all records, regardless of availability of SSN for that observation.

III. Filename Convention

Use SYSTEM_dmg_STARTYR_ENDYR.txt where SYSTEM is the agreed upon abbreviation for your school system; STARTYR is the first year of the data you are sending; and ENDYR is the last year of the data you are sending. For example, utsys_dmg_2001_2015.txt is the file name for the University of Texas System's input file with data from 2001 to 2015. Data for a single academic year should still include two years. For example, utsys_dmg_2001_2002.txt for academic year 2001-2002.

IV. Observation Level

An observation in this dataset is a unique individual-institution-degree level. Residency ought to be determined based on first year of entry into that degree level, since there are transitions, especially during graduate school.

V. Valid Years

We request as many years of historical data as you can send, starting with 2001. If you are unable to go back to 2001, that is fine. We will not process any years before 2001 because of coverage issues with our wage data before that calendar year. If you are sending new years of data, please do not resend data for years from a prior submission, unless explicitly asked to.
