Federal Workers – Project Goal

Integrate person characteristics of Federal workers and establishment characteristics of Federal agencies into LEHD Infrastructure Files using data from Office of Personnel Management (OPM)

Federal Workers – Steps of Project

Constructing "UI-Like" Files

- Filtering out Duplicate Federal Worker Records
- Determining Accurate Quarterly Wages for All Federal Workers
- Imputing Quarterly Wages for Part-Time and Seasonal Federal Workers

- Geocoding Work Location
- Integrating SEINUNIT Identifier into Production Process
- Defining Successor-Predecessor Relationships in OPM Data

Federal Workers - OPM Data

Primary Data Files (Central Personnel Data File)

- Status File
 - Quarterly Snapshot of Federal Worker Characteristics: PIK, DOB, agency, duty station, annualized total pay, occupation, education level, race, sex
- Dynamics File
 - Documentation of Federal Worker Personnel Actions: monthly actions aggregated by quarter

Auxiliary Data Files

- Personnel Office Indicator File
 - Location Information for Federal Agencies: primary address and zip code for personnel office contact, but not latitude/longitude
- Standard Code Table File
 - Lookup Table for Status and Dynamics Files

FUTURE WORK and DOWNSTREAM ISSUES

Geocoding Work Location

 How to ensure that the location information is meaningful to geocoding software (mapping VARNAME to physical address)

Integrating SEINUNIT Identifier into Production Process

 Currently imputed when data does not stem from Minnesota – processes need to accommodate a mix of available and unavailable SEINUNIT information

Defining Successor-Predecessor Relationships in OPM Data

 How to define and identify Successor-Predecessor Relationships in OPM based on administrative info (relationships based on worker flows are automatically determined)

Federal Workers – Integrating into QWI

FUTURE WORK and DOWNSTREAM ISSUES

Assessing impact on current QWI

- Initial assessment of inclusion of additional records into 'All' ownership category – impact on measures as-is
- Initial assessment of new breakout by non-private employment – state vs. federal employees, additional computational burden, additional data storage size
- TBD: how to break out (or not) federal employment

New variables on QWI?
