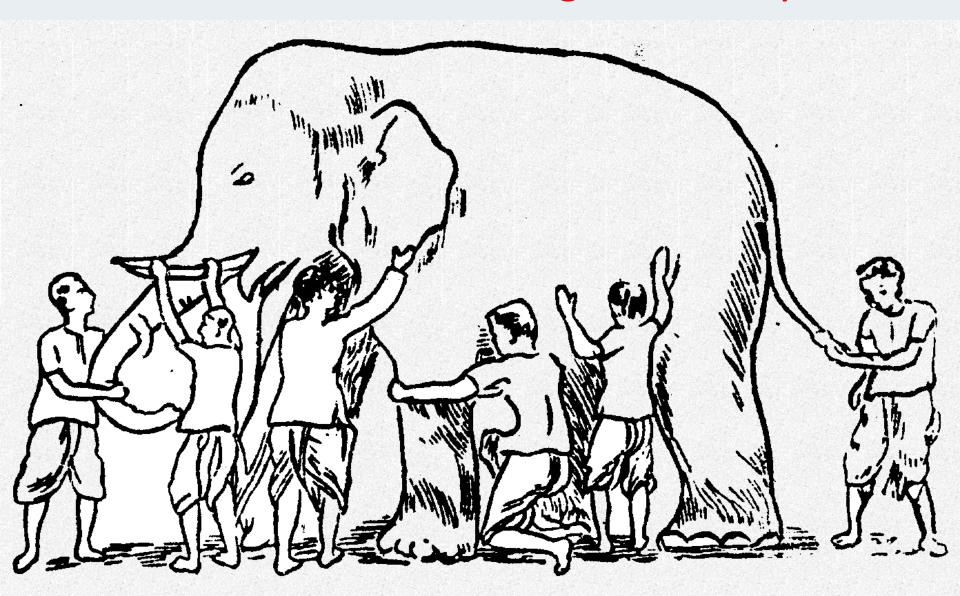

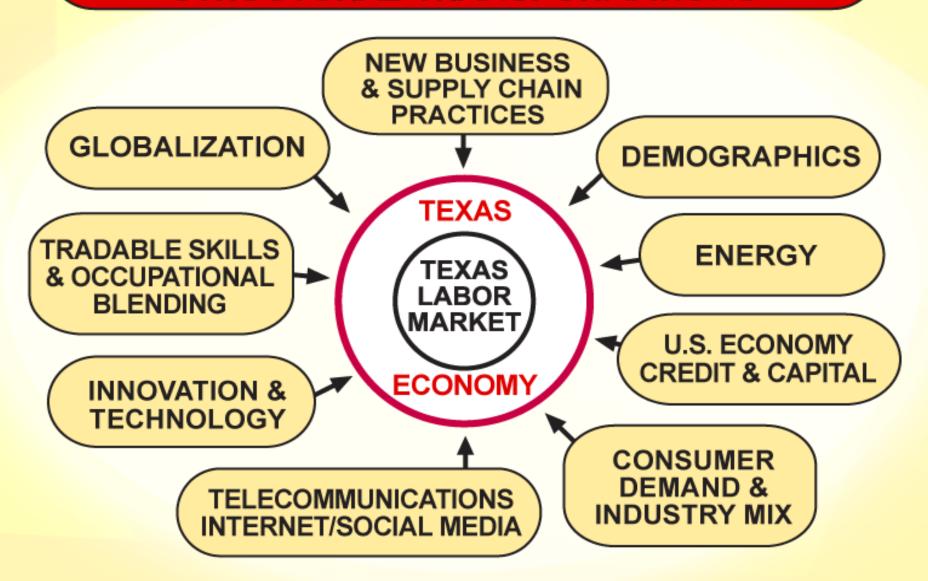

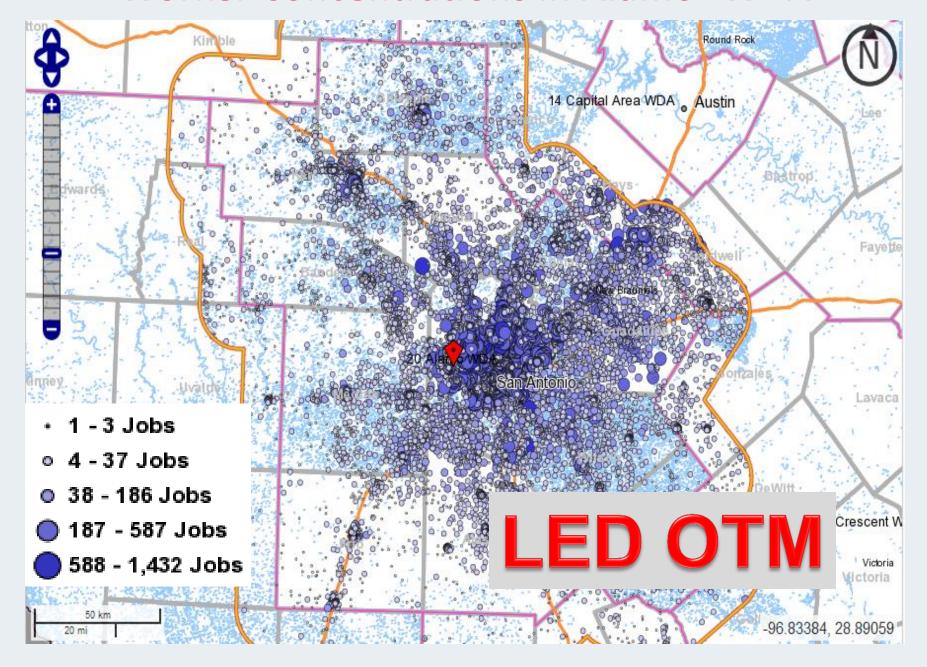
The Storyline:

The Alamo workforce board in San **Antonio Texas wants to better** understand their regional economy to provide guidance and support to the local community college system to provide marketresponsive training programs

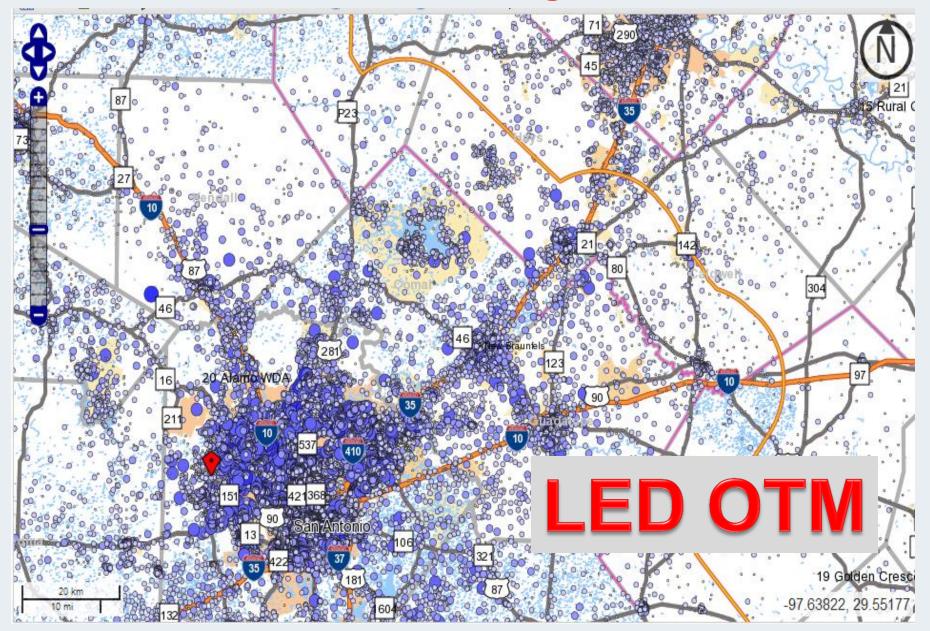
The Changing Face of the Texas Labor Market STRUCTURAL TRANSFORMATIONS



Worker Concentrations in Alamo LWDA



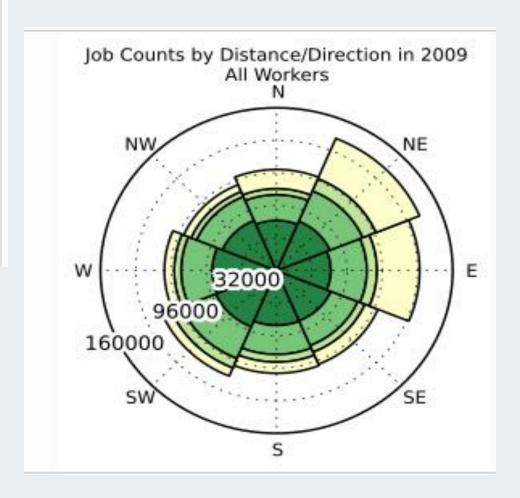
Alamo Commuting Patterns

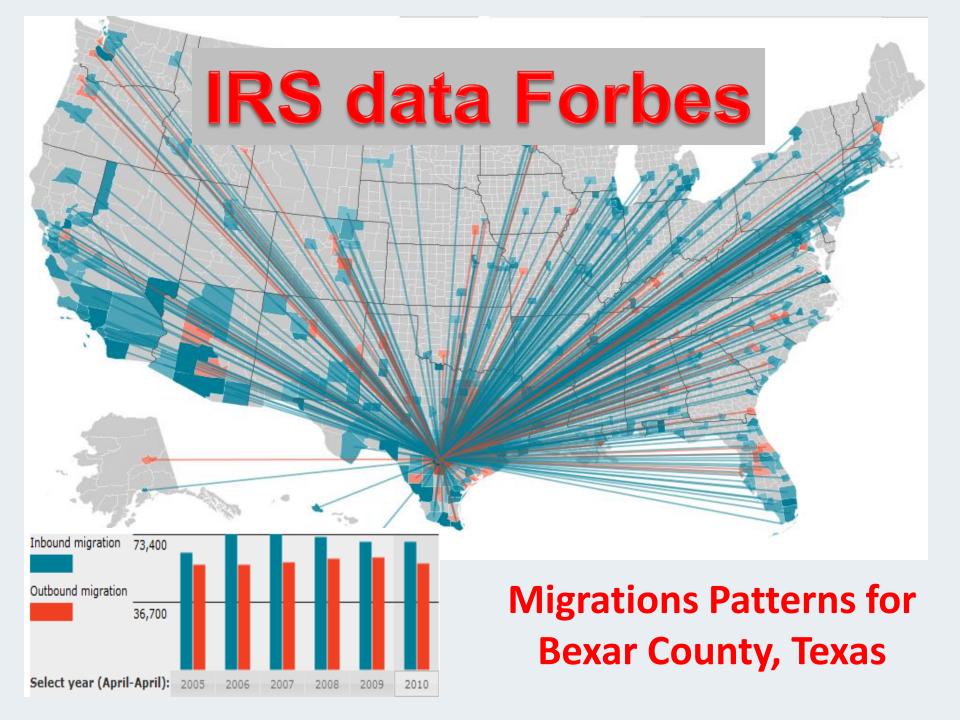

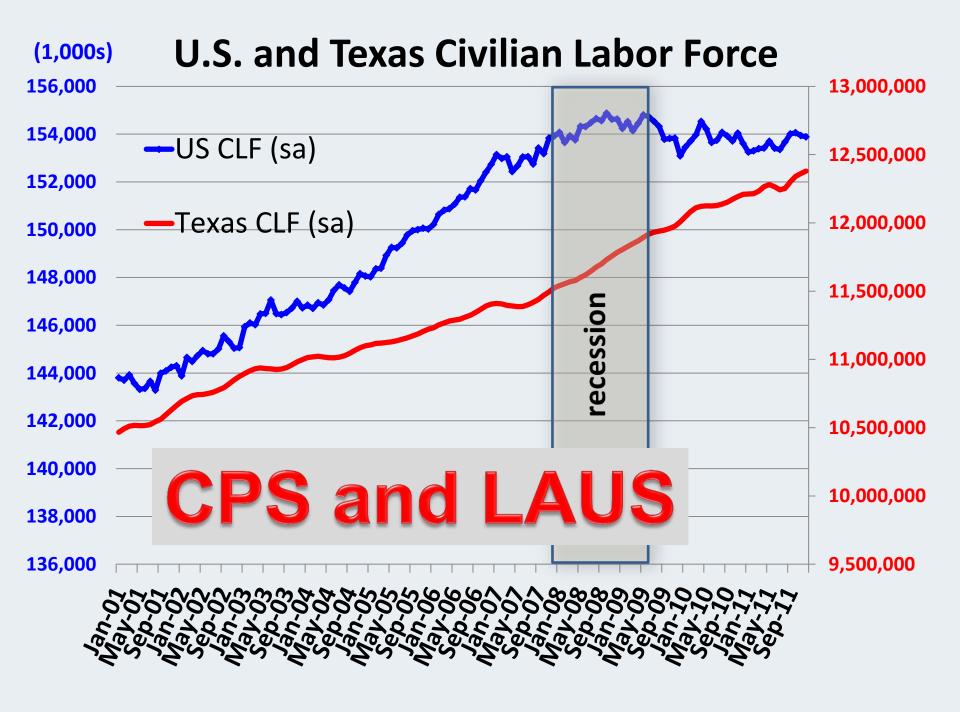

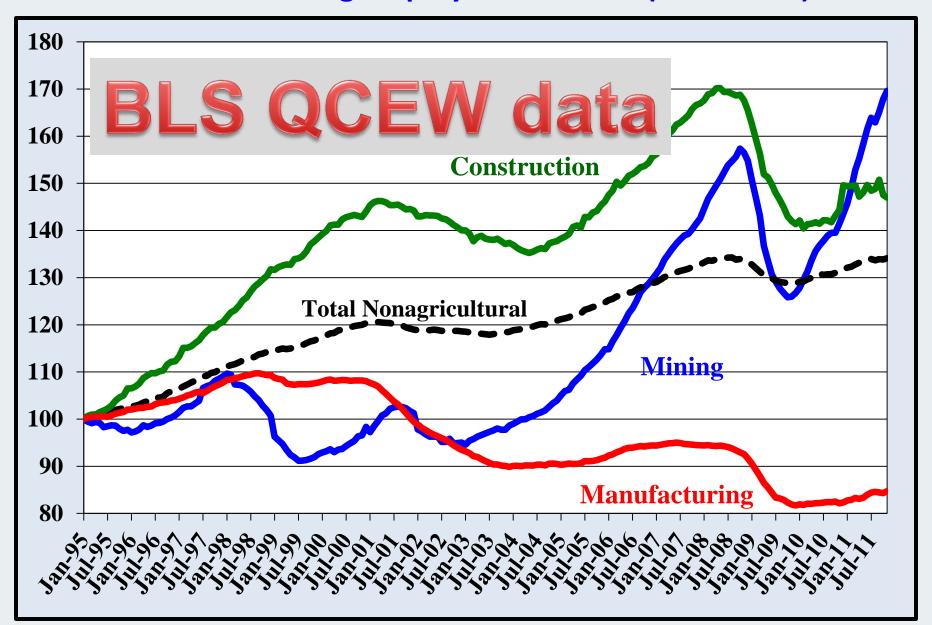

Goods Producing Employment Trends (1995-2011)

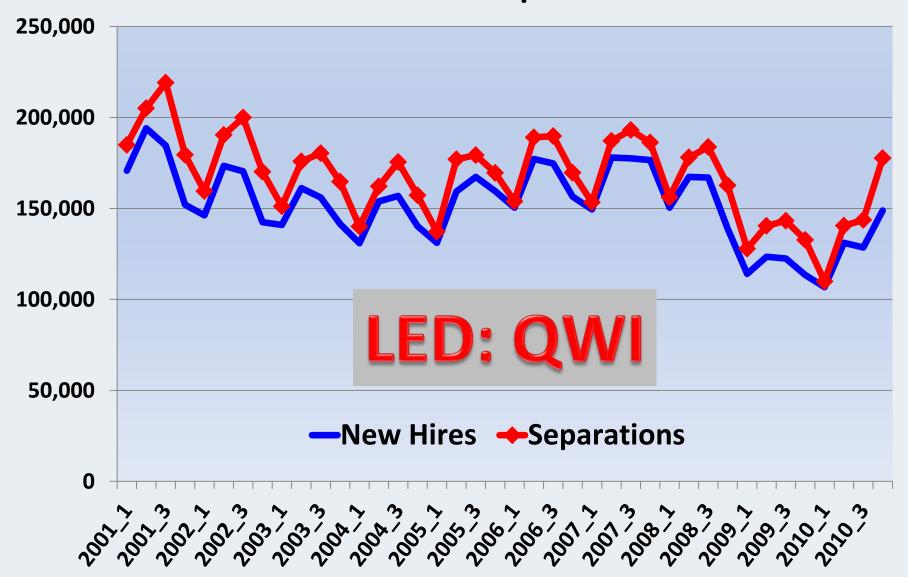

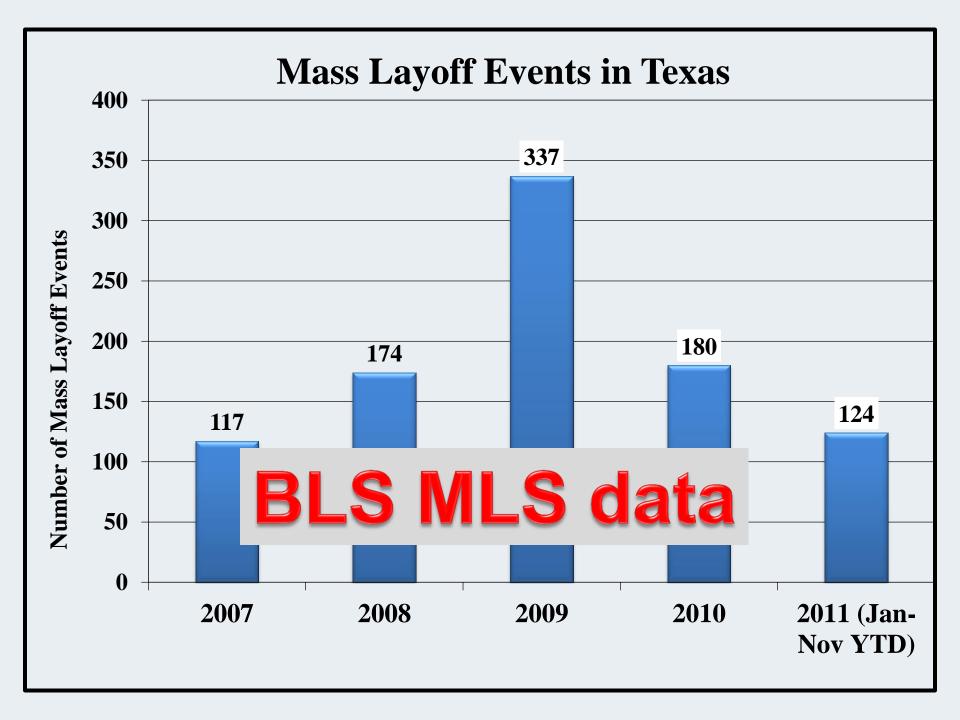

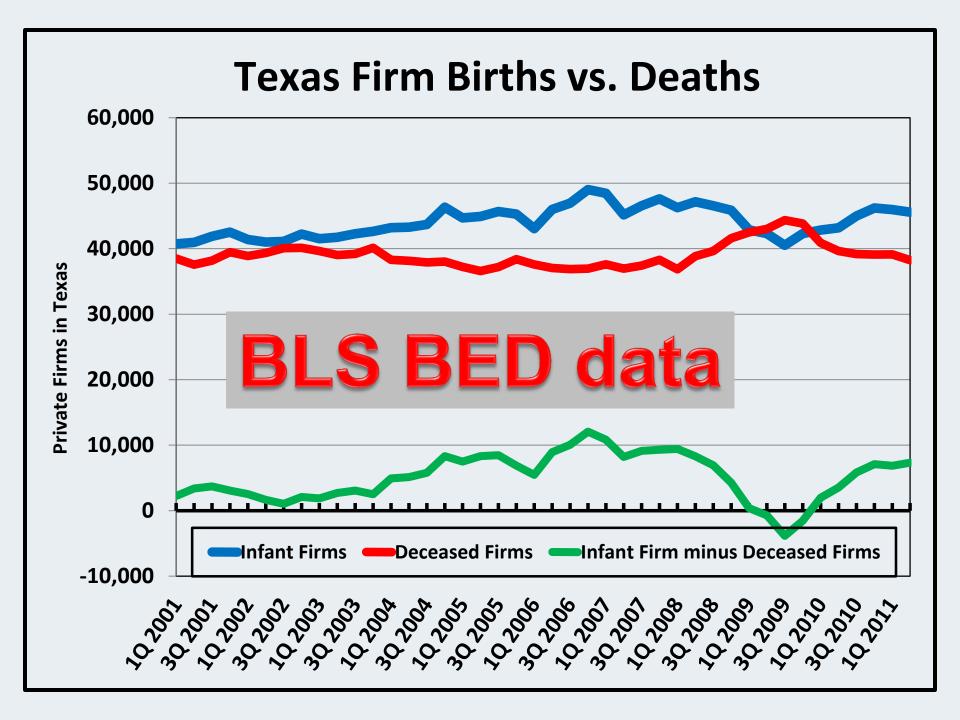
Increase in Job Activity: San Antonio MSA New Hires vs. Separations



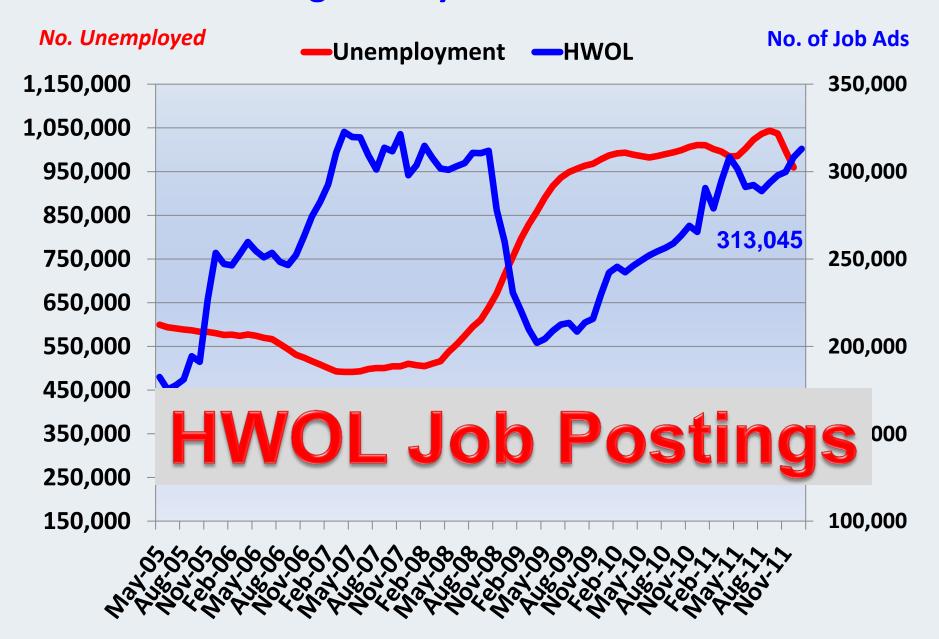
San Antonio MSA New Hire Earnings vs. All Workers
